- Remaining regions yet to participate: Huron County, Perth, Wellington, Dufferin (RTO4 &6); North west Ontario (RTO13c)
- 1,568 + business and locations certified as bicycle-friendly
- 2020 renewal partners: South Eastern Ontario; Manitoulin Island and LeCloche Foothills; Peterborough & City of Kawartha Lakes; Haldimand & Norfolk Counties; Haliburton Highlands; Grey County; Niagara Region; Durham Region; Chatham Kent; Prescott Russell

Marketing & Promotions

- Ontario By Bike Rides:
 - 4 weekend tours in 2019 Trent Severn Trail Tour; 1000 Islands St. Lawrence River Ride; Ottawa City & Country; Oxford Rural Roads
 - > 141 total number of riders
 - > All but 1 ride sold out, most well in advance
 - Extremely high rider satisfaction and return rate
 - Economic impact: 3 day tour \$553 pp, \$21k total; 2 day tour \$371pp, \$14.5k total
 - Legacy itineraries online, cyclists making use of them
 - 2020 rides to be announced in February









Ontario By Bike - Transportation Options Status Updates

2019/2020 Marketing Partnerships

- Cycling in Ontario / Le vélo en Ontario Guide
 - Close to 40,000 copies of 2019 distributed early
 - Almost 16,000 digital views & downloads





- Readers survey: Over 85% found the guide "Useful" or "Very Useful" in planning a cycling trip; More than 62% of readers visited a destinations featured in the 2019 Cycling in Ontario Guide; Over 75% shared the guide with friends or family
- > 2020 sales about to commence with new print & digital version available end of February
- > We need partners news for editorial and photos for consideration

- Event Partnerships:
 - Ontario & Quebec Shows, 8 partners 8 shows/events
 - Both Toronto & Montreal Bike Shows are changing venues in 2020
- Digital Advertising & Content Development:
 - Leaderboard, Skyscraper, Event Banners, Enewsletter Banners generated exposure and leads for partners
 - Content development with blog postings reached large audience, up to 1,600 reads each

- <u>Cycle Tourism in Ontario: A Report on the State of Ontario's Cycle Tourism Sector (2019)</u> New in February 2019, an update on 2015 report <u>From Niche to Now</u>. Includes new primary research and data shared from a variety of partners and sources, providing insight into the status of this growing tourism sector, and comparing data to earlier years, to track growth and changes.
- Developing Cycling Itineraries for the Cycle Tourism Market (2019) Examining examples world-wide and best practices research and to provide recommendations for developing cycling itineraries for the cycle tourism market and also work towards recommending and creating a standardized itinerary template for display and promotional purposes.
 - Best Practices for Cycle Tourism Wayfinding (2019) Highlights the best practices for cycle tourism wayfinding with an aim to provide a snapshot of successful initiatives and recommendations to help future decision-making as it relates to the implementation cycle tourism wayfinding projects.
